### **Candidate Statement**

Promoting the quality of architectural education has been the core value of the ACSA since its founding in 1921. Despite the current financial difficulties faced by our institutions and the profession, we remain committed to this value. The ACSA has done much in recent years to advance the role of architecture and architectural education. The ever-increasing list of member schools, both nationally and internationally, is a testament to that success.

Accreditation is one of the ways we promote quality architectural education. To that end, the NAAB along with the collateral organizations of ACSA, AIA, NCARB and AIAS will be reviewing accreditation metrics in July of 2013 at the Accreditation Review Conference. The preparation for the ARC has been a critical focus for the ACSA for the past year and the outcomes will need to be addressed following the July meeting. Now is a time when we can focus on faculty development and fortify the presence of architecture and architectural educators in conversations about the future of the discipline and the profession.

The role of ACSA Treasurer requires someone with the ability to work collaboratively with the President and Executive Director to provide oversight and stewardship of the fiduciary side of the association. The ACSA has benefited in recent years from the excellent oversight of Craig Barton, Nathaniel Belcher, and Graham Livesey as well as the ACSA Executive Director Michael Monti and the entire Board of Directors. In the role of treasurer I would look forward to continuing their legacy of sound advice and supervision of the ACSA budget and planning. In my current position as director of a school of architecture I have become accustomed to managing



modest financial means to accomplish substantial departmental goals, as well as thinking entrepreneurially to build opportunities in research and teaching for faculty and students.

The Treasurer of the ACSA shares a role with the Board of Directors in setting strategic goals, planning for the coming years, and setting initiatives in motion. As a faculty member at Lousiana State University, I am participating in interdisciplinary initiatives that promote the value of design thinking across multiple disciplines to address issues of climate change and environmental sensitivity. Architectural education creates innovative thinkers who can work to address the problems of energy and environment for the future. Our faculty and students should be positioned to take on the leadership roles in these nationally and internationally significant discussions. If elected, I would support the member schools and Board of Directors in expanding our role and expertise in this conversation.
