Candidate Statement

It is an honor to be nominated for the position of the west regional director for the ACSA. I have been actively involved in activities sponsored by ACSA, including serving as topic chair, paper reviewer and presenter at regional and national conferences. I have had the tremendous opportunity to work on three different faculties in the west, the University of Arizona, the University of Colorado and currently at the School of Architecture and Planning at the University of New Mexico. The experience of serving at these three institutions and attending many ACSA conferences has allowed me the opportunity to learn from my peers and formulate collegial relationships that I value.

In 2009, I had the opportunity to co-chair the southwest regional conference, Chang[e]ing Identities: Design, Culture + Technology. This conference formulated a critical discussion about the changes occurring in architectural education and the profession. The critical dialogue of this conference and my interest in emerging technologies has refocused my academic pursuits and given me the opportunity to serve as director of the Art, Research, Technology and Science Iab, an interdisciplinary digital media laboratory here at the University of New Mexico. In my tenure as director, we have been fortunate to acquire funding from many national grant agencies including the National Science Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities and National Endowment for the Arts. The core mission of the Iaboratory revolves around design innovation and my architectural background plays a key role in a collaborative



environment. As an architectural educator, I believe we need to continue to broaden our core mission and give architectural educators and our students new opportunities to be successful in a shifting and complex professional environment.

I have had the good fortune of working with Geraldine Forbes-Isais former ACSA president and current dean of the School of Architecture and Planning here at the University of New Mexico. We have, and continue to collaborate in communities across the state developing a variety of design projects that engage a diversity of cultural settings. We are able to conduct research and apply our architectural design skills in a variety of non-traditional applications. This is best represented in a funded research project where we developed an open source digital archive documenting architectural and cultural landscapes in historic communities in northern New Mexico. Working with a variety of design disciplines, we were able to be the lead investigators in creating a unique cultural archive that aides communities across the state.

I value the contribution that ACSA provides to the academy and the critical role it has in reshaping our profession. I will continue to be an advocate to improve architectural education, define new opportunities and endorse innovation and creativity. I believe in interdisciplinary collaboration and will continue to champion for academic diversity.

I am extremely humbled to be given the opportunity to represent my region and envision being a positive voice and advocating at the national level. Growing up in the southwest and teaching at three institutions in the west region, I have a deep appreciation for the culture, the architecture and the landscape. I would be honored to be given an opportunity to serve the diverse faculties that comprise this region.
