## **Candidate Statement**

Architectural education and practice has become increasingly broad, diverse, collaborative and global. As a professor and active practitioner with a professional interest in inclusive education, my focus has been on developing projects inside and out of the classroom that support education through public interest projects in the community. These have involved students as designers and makers working with practitioners including those with specialized knowledge along with non-profit entities.

The northeast is a region defined by diversity through its varied immigrant populations, culturally diverse cities, and communities representing a wide range of ethnic and economic backgrounds. Architecture programs in this region can be leaders in addressing the range of career possibilities that are available to our students upon graduation and geared to a rich variety of industry jobs available in the profession today. Seeing leadership as an expression of citizenship, we can provide educational opportunities that not only attend to the 99% but are of the 99% in student diversity locally and abroad, strengthening enrollment of underrepresented groups.

We can use this time as an opportunity to address the following issues as a collaborative group. Its goals would be to answer to issues of broadening the reach of architectural practice and developing models and collaborations to facilitate a versatility of professional growth in the field. This would include regional technological links, curricular offerings, and online project-based development across our programs:

- Increase opportunities for civic engagement and leadership across universities and programs, developing new points and means of contact across project-based learning opportunities that address public entities in innovative conversation and collaboration
- In advocating for the design industry, develop initiatives with business entities and their local
  offices with a goal to provide collaborative opportunities while enhancing public understanding of the creativity of students educated with a
  professional architectural degree. This can be used as an opportunity to build intersections between multiple design programs and regionally
  located businesses
- Attract students from a broader range of backgrounds supported by teaching models and/or projects that address multiple learning styles
- Create opportunities for collaborative travel programs in spring, winter and summer breaks that support the development of a student's sensitivity to international contexts, through observation, design and working with global practitioners and international institutions

I am honored to be considered for the Northeast Regional Director, and if elected would bring my collaborative and development experience to working on these issues.
