

1. Situation


This project proposes that *transparent urban space*—that which allows for the simultaneous reading + use of clearly public space and semi-public space—can act as the point of connection + commonality between **opaque** buildings and their given urban context. This place of overlap where the space of a building is fused to that of the city/public urban sequence, so as to produce a hybrid, is at the center of our discussion_

3. Site


The site is located in Manhattan at the intersection of Houston and Lafayette Streets [@/in gaseteria]. The plastic edge of plates along Houston Street act as a threshold to soho and signify a major shift in the formal structure of the grid. The project offers the opportunity to make an effective larger scale urban gesture due to its position as a dislodged parcel within the grid, its ability to mark an unusually long/linear space, and the challenge to produce a spatial experience that is both/and_public + not-public_
