PROJECT ABSTRACT

In autumn semester of 1998, a collaborative design process began with the Little Big Horn College, the Montana State University School of Architecture, and professional practitioners to envision a new campus for the Little Big Horn College on the Crow Reservation in southeastern Montana. After four years of effort, this new campus is now becoming a reality. The first two buildings of the new campus plan, the Classroom Building and the Cultural Learning Lodge, are under construction and slated for completion in May of 2003. The process has been a unique collaboration between a community, an architecture

school, and the architectural profession to produce a built work. The process was initiated by Dr. Janine Pease Pretty-on-Top as President of the Little Big Horn College. It has been led throughout by Associate Professor Daniel J. Glenn, a descendant of the Crow Tribe. The project has sought to engage the faculty, staff, and students of the Little Big Horn College and the Crow community it serves in an interactive process of self-determination for the physical future of the college. The final master plan and building designs were developed by Daniel J. Glenn, principal of Glenn & Glenn Design Associates, as a Design and Cultural Consultant to CTA Architects & Engineers of Billings, Montana.
