## 2019 International Housing Design Student Competition

**Washington, D.C., October 11, 2019 –** Winners are announced for the *HERE+NOW:* A House for the 21st Century student design competition, organized by Custom Residential Architects Network (AIA CRAN®)—an American Institute of Architects Knowledge Community—in partnership with the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture (ACSA).
