
These resources support your Architecture 170 assignments by linking to scholarly material resources. It also includes basic information about accessing Library resources from off campus.

I recommend using the **proxy server** to access resources from off campus. You should install the <u>EZProxy bookmarklet</u> by dragging the "EZProxy icon" to your browser toolbar and clicking on it before attempting to access proprietary (UCB-paid) articles. 
**KEY RESOURCES:** You may want to bookmark the best place to find scholarly material for this class:

- <u>HathiTrust</u> (books)


<u>JSTOR</u> has many articles related to architecture, and the full text articles are in the database. JSTOR searches every word in the article, so you can construct more "narrow" searches (use more keywords)



Art & Architecture Source is another place to explore thematic concepts and specific resources:



<u>HathiTrust</u> is a database of digitized books. Clock on "Log In", select "University of California Berkeley" and use your CalNet ID to enter. If the book is no longer copyrighted or we hold a copy in print, you'll be able to gain temporary access. (A video about using HathiTrust is <u>here</u>).





- Artstor for high resolution images


OskiCat has many online volumes (you'll use your CalNet ID to login). Find them by selecting "available online" in the box to the far right of the Keyword search box.



Oxford Art Online - has short encyclopedic articles that you can cite and that point to other useful resources.



<u>ARTstor</u> has high resolution art and architecture images and contains a limited number of architectural plans and elevations. You'll need to create a personal account to save images.
