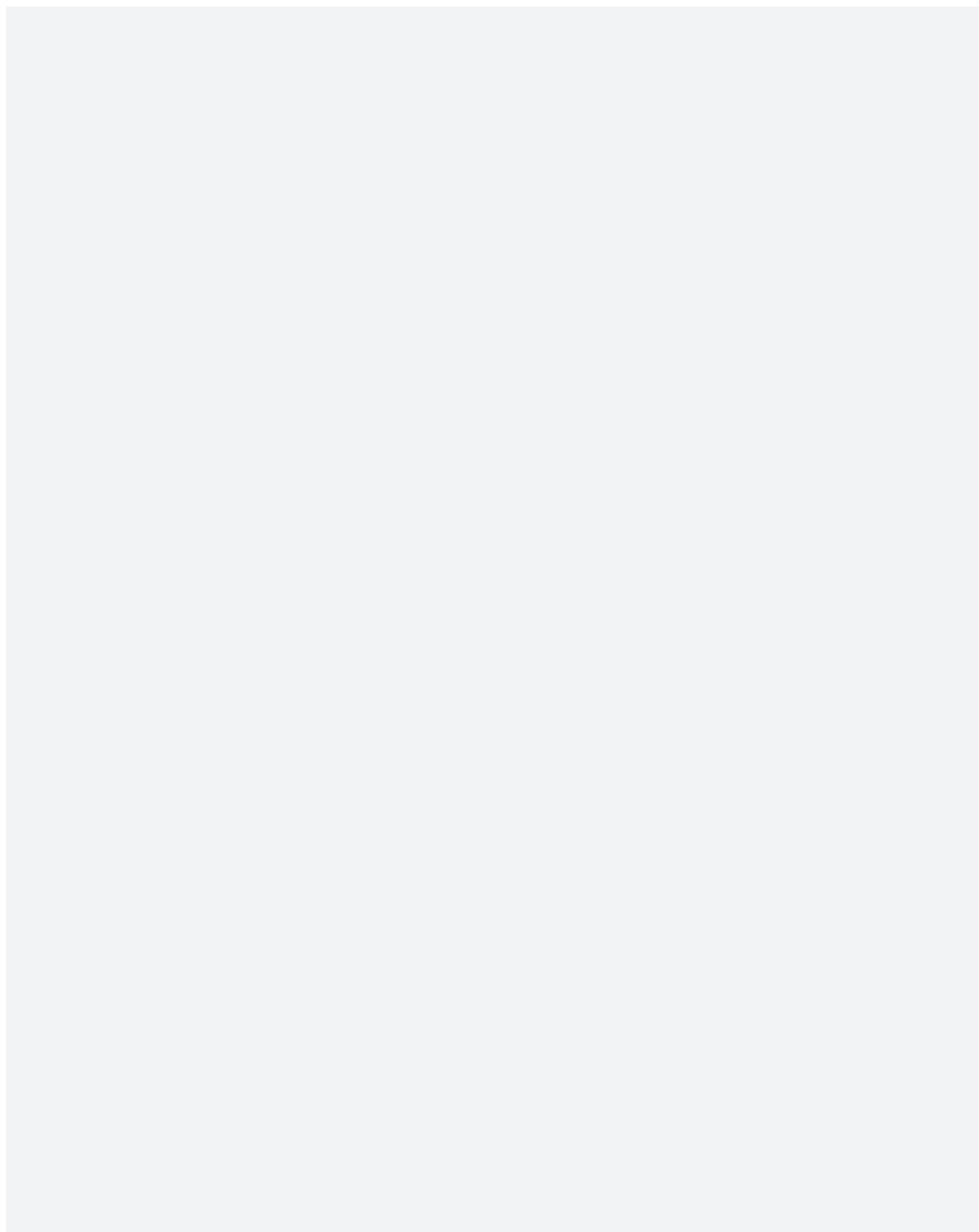


Figure 1. Image *caption*. Image credit.

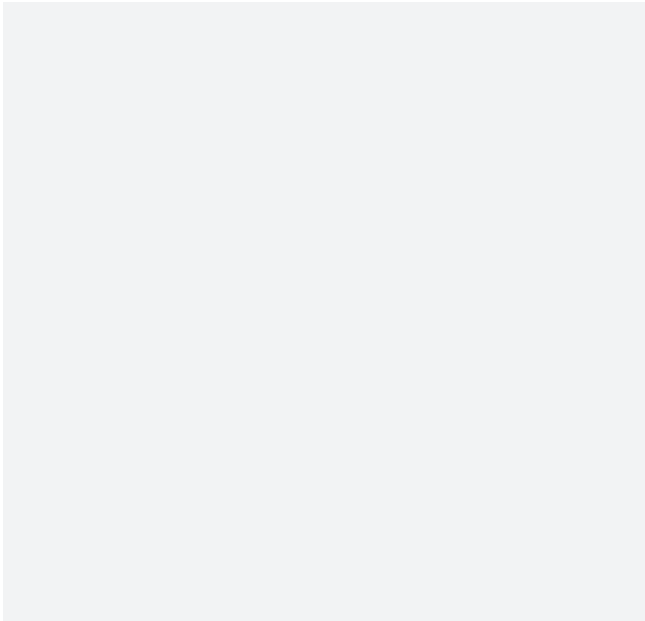


Figure 2. Image caption. Image credit.

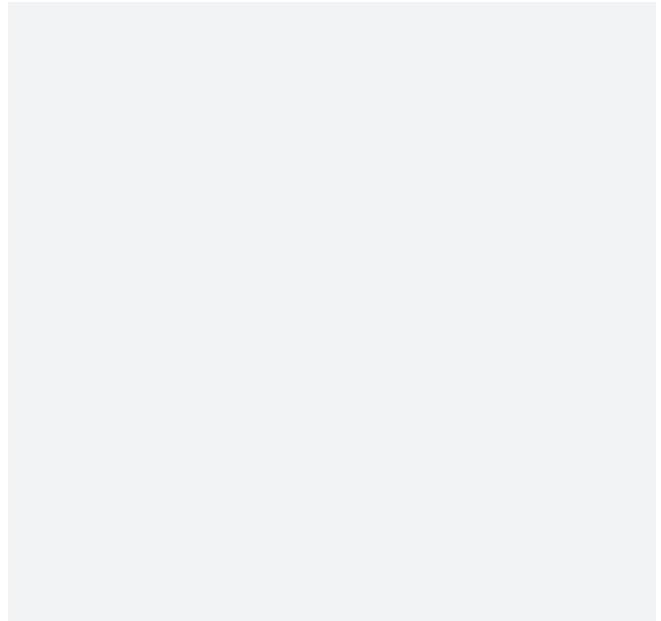


Figure 3. Image caption. Image credit.

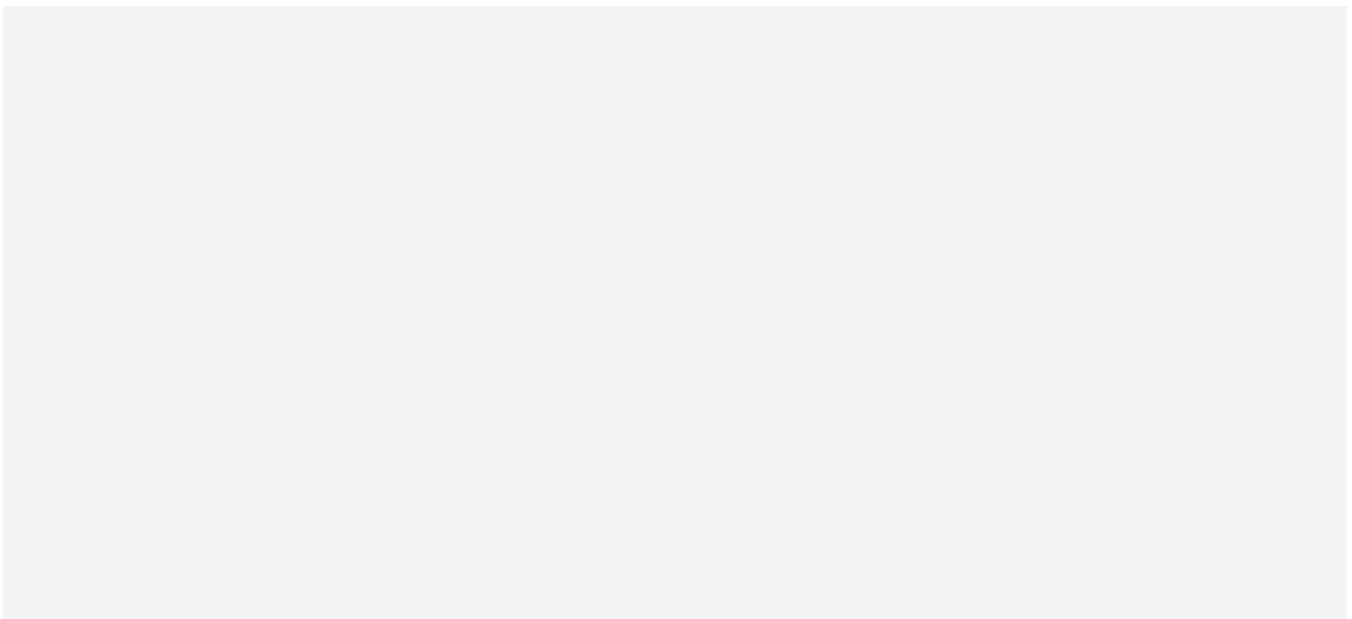


Figure 4. Image caption. Image credit

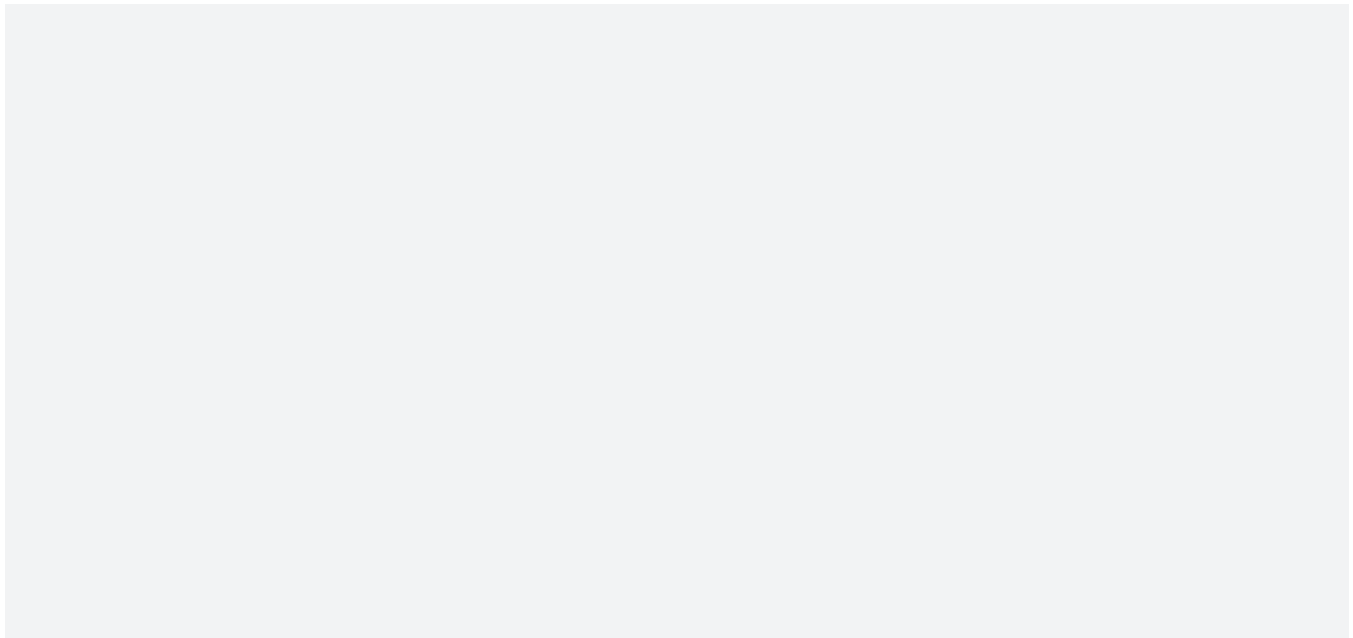


Figure 5. Image caption. Image credit.

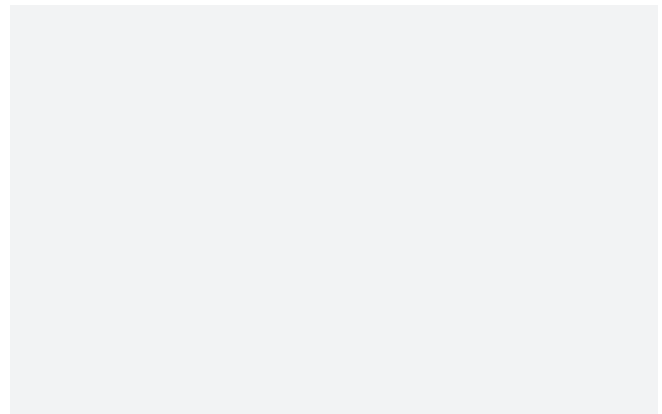


Figure 6. Image caption. Image credit.

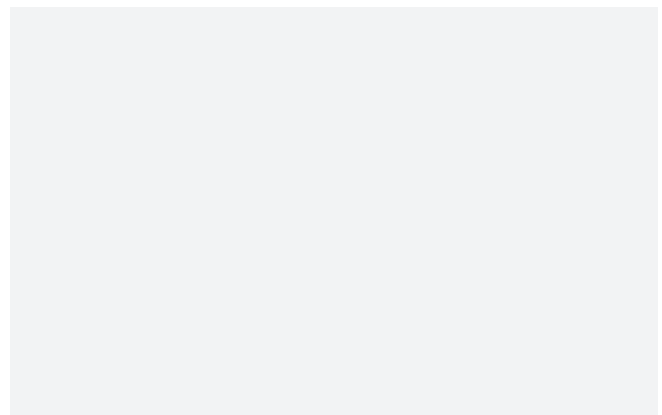


Figure 7. Image caption. Image credit.

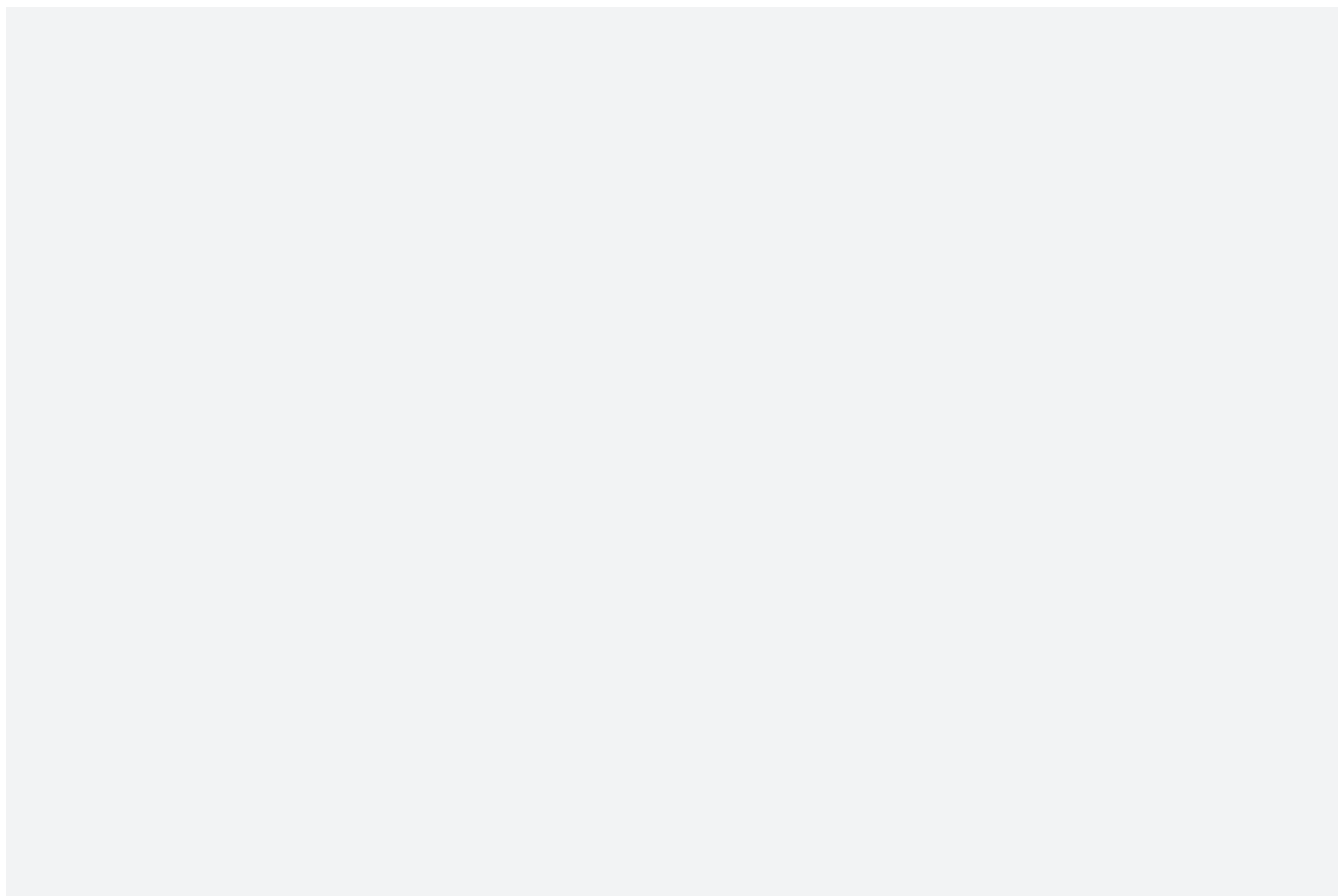


Figure 8. Image caption. Image credit.

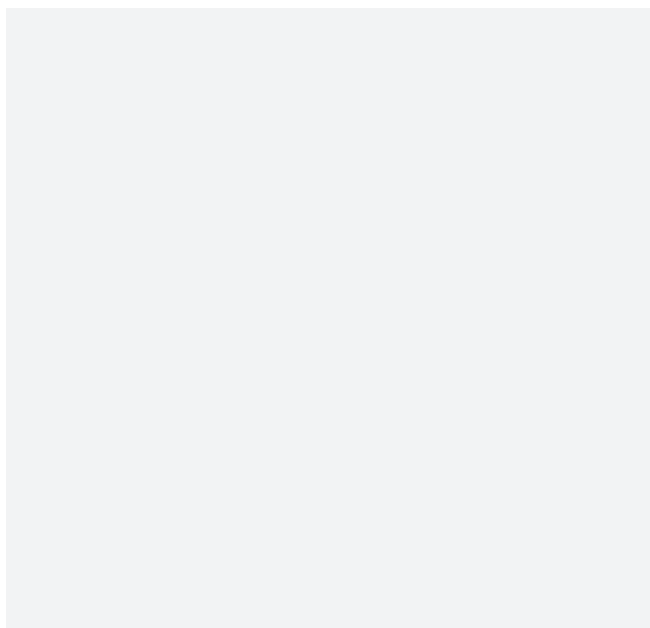


Figure 9. Image caption. Image credit.

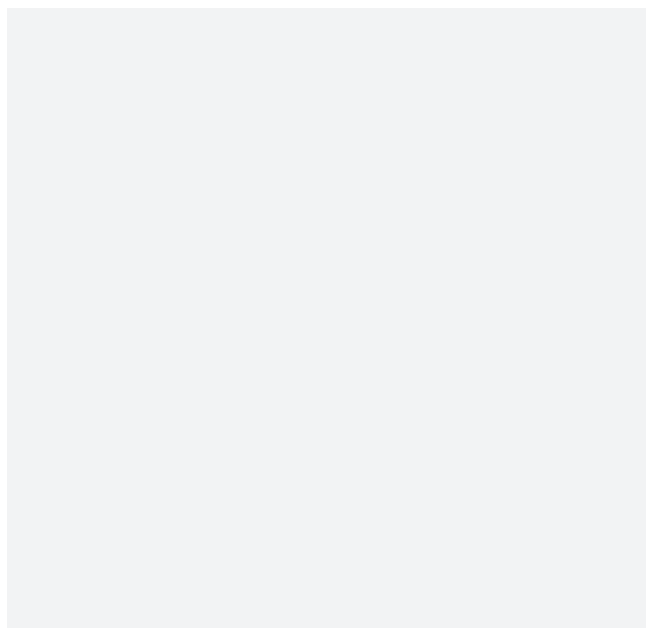


Figure 10. Image caption. Image credit.
